Flooding

At the August meeting of the West Otago Community Board issues with the flooding in July were brought to the table by members of the public voicing their concerns about the event and suggesting how we could do things better. It was resolved to form a small group to work alongside the contractors in the event of a similar emergency to alleviate future problems.

Pattersons Creek

The contract has been completed satisfactorily but the Community Board is aware there are still issues regarding flooding in the lower part of Tapanui and these will be addressed in the future.
