Harder hitting graphics for the billboards were presented by the Community Support & Development Advisor with the Youth Council feeling that the more graphic the better to get the message across.

Youth Councillors discussed working with other Youth Councils to petition local MPs to try and gain some traction at a national level. As a starting point Youth Councillor Mann will investigate what the current law is now before progressing this with other Youth Councils.

The report provides an update of the work being delivered by the Clutha District Youth Development Programme.

RECOMMENDATION

Programme delivery provided by Youth Worker Margaret Cardno.

1 Mentoring

Supporting students with social & emotional development, cognitive development, identity development to lead on to positive outcomes.

Margaret will be continuing to work weekly with 2 students at South Otago High School and a young person referred by Oranga Tamariki.

2 Life and Employment Skills Group Learning Sessions.

Weekly Thursday sessions in Balclutha provide life and employment skills. Presently attended by young people from the Balclutha Link Centre, sessions are open to any young people. Participation in this group varies from week to week. Recently people have been enjoying doing some drawing while also discussing their concerns with the group, problem solving issues and supporting each other.

3 Secondary School Support:

3.1 South Otago High School

Travellers Programme has concluded. Participants said they enjoyed the programme which focused on resilience, and they said they shared personal information they had never shared previously with anyone else.

3.2 Catlins Area School

Leadership Skills

Due to most students being away for the final session, Margaret will be meeting with the students for one final session in the first week of term 3. A great outcome from these sessions has been that based on the leadership skills the students have learnt, the principal has invited Margaret to support the students to participate in reviews that the school is undertaking so the student voice is heard before decisions affecting them are made.

3.3 Tokomairiro High School-

Peer Relationships group has concluded and although just a small group, students felt that they built their confidence and now have more skills to cope with how they manage their emotions and interactions with their peers.

3.4 School Visits – Youth Survey follow up.

Margaret has visited Tokomairiro High School, South Otago High School, Blue Mountain College and Catlins Area School to speak with small groups of students as a follow up to the Youth Survey conducted in 2020 to find out what they see as the main concerns students currently have. The top concerns across all the schools were:

- Wellbeing: Coping with workload especially for senior students
- The rise in the number of students who are vaping.

The Youth Council submitted successfully to the Clutha District Council Long Term Plan 2021/31 for:

- 1. Financial support of \$7,000 to complete the billboard project.
- 2. Financial support of \$10,000 to deliver further school and community presentations by Pat Buckley of Amped 4 Life.

A progress report for both these activities will be reported to this meeting.

Quiz Night: At the March 8 Youth Council workshop, the following was decided.

"That the Youth Council go ahead to deliver a quiz night go ahead to raise funds to go towards the cost of the billboards."

This is included for planning and delivery in a separate agenda item.

2 Summary

M.A.C. Clutha is endorsed by Clutha District Council and is included in the Community Development Work Program

Pat Buckley has been confirmed and liaison is underway with Clutha District secondary schools to host Amped 4 Life talks the 1st to the 3rd of September. Specific days and times for each school are being confirmed.

One evening community talk is planned for Thursday the 2 September.

The Community Support and Development advisor and the Youth Worker will visit each school assembly the week of the 3rd of August to assist Youth Councillors to promote these presentations.

Interest had been expressed by Gore police to invite Pat to speak within the Gore district, however this has not been detailed or confirmed.

This project is an impressive testimonial to the Clutha District Youth Council that they have been the catalyst for beginning this valuable community awakening. Reaction and response to date is proof that there is a definite need for a community response to this devastating issue.
