Clutha District Council Road Safety Coordinator Rachel Harrison is working in collaboration with Youth Council members to plan the project and delivery.

Details of The Ripple Effect are:

The Ripple Effect project has the intent being to show just how much one crash affects so many.

The plan is to do a series of videos using local FENZ, Police, Ambulance, undertaker, Nurses, Doctors, anyone that may be involved at a local level with the consequence of a fatal or serious crash. This is to gather their thoughts, both professionally and personally on how these tragedies take a toll within a community. Interviews will also include family members who may have experienced this as well.

Outcomes intended from the project are:

- To demonstrate how one small moment of distraction can change the lives of so many.
- Promotion of safe driving practices through education and awareness
- Predominantly for 17-25yr demographic but important for all drivers
- Letting young drivers know that a crash, fatal or not, does not just affect the driver of the vehicle.

As well SADD students are being invited to take part with the Youth Council with:

- 1. Planning who we can interview, preparing a plan of how, when, what do we need etc
- 2. What questions we can ask
- 3. Taping the interviews
- 4. Editing and putting together the material.
- 5. Where we can make use of the finished product.
- Interviews are completed Editing of the completed interviews is well underway. I have sourced a "sign board" for use with images of whoever is wanting to be included in the final cut. Let me know if you are interested and we can get the images done.
- In addition, this project is so close to being completed. It is hoped that by the meeting date we will be able to announce the plans for launching it to the community.

Issue and concern with the culture of acceptance of alcohol within the Clutha District was raised by Youth Councillors in mid-2022.

The topic was workshopped prior to the 8th of May Youth Council meeting where it was decided to have a dedicated workshop on the 22nd May 2023

Key aims of this workshop would include how to raise awareness of the impact and issue of alcohol use within the Clutha District to initially "Explore the option of positive alternatives."

Some exceptional work by Youth Councillors resulted in the following key takeaways:

- To initiate this project with a survey to youth, to establish stats on a median age youth start drinking, who supplies their alcohol and what alternative options would they like to see in the district. The survey will be confidential (so anonymous) but will have a separate tear off on the bottom of the form to go in the draw for a prize.
- All the schools in the district, will be invited to support their youth to take part.
- Youth councillors supported by Council staff will speak in the respective assemblies where hard copies of the survey will be available to hand out and have the students fill in there and then
- The survey will also be made available at the Cross Rec Centre, Balclutha Pool, Telford and Tokomairiro Training.

This project has not gained traction as some time frame requirements were not met by youth council. We will re workshop, make some decisions prior to this meeting and report further to the meeting.

It was announced at the Annual Plan Decisions meeting that Youth Council received up to \$15,000 to support CACTUS.

Craig, Ginny, and Lilly met on the 6 June 2023 to commence planning;

CACTUS will run this year in term 4, for 7 weeks 6.30-7.30 (training), 7.30-8am (breakfast) and 8-8.30am (shower), with the 'longest day' happening on the first Saturday in December with the towing of the fire engine being part of the Clutha District Santa Parade.

We are looking at having a meeting with Clutha Development to get assistance with advertising for a trainer and coordinator.
