Anyone over the age of 18 can stand for election as long as you are a New Zealand citizen and are enrolled on the electoral roll.


Nominations open July 19 and you have till August 16 at midday to hand in your nomination.

no overdue fees for children



The Clutha District Libraries will no longer charge overdue fees for material on loan to children.

This has been done to ensure that all children in Clutha have real access to free books from the library.

One of the key roles of a public library is to support reading and literacy in children and encourage them to use the library. However we know that many families in our communities cannot afford to pay overdue fees on library books and other materials.

The result is barriers to use - because families either stop using the library – or the fear of fines keeps them out of libraries. So the very children whom we need to help most with free access to books and language miss out.

Reading and literacy has been shown to be adversely affected by low income. In particular, children from low income backgrounds are often disadvantaged when it comes to exposure to reading and language.

Positions

During 2018, Clutha District Council undertook a representation arrangements review (a review of wards, community boards, boundaries, number of elected members etc). The final proposal, confirmed by the Local Government Commission on 9 April 2019, retains the existing number of councillors, wards, community board members and community boards but with some slightly modified ward and community board boundaries. Elections are required for the following positions:

To be eligible to stand for election, a candidate will need to be nominated by two electors whose names appear on the electoral roll within the respective area that a candidate is standing for.

Electoral roll

All parliamentary electors, including those on the Māori Electoral Roll are automatically enrolled on the Resident Roll, at the address where they live.

Any alterations to the Resident Roll (e.g change of address details, including new postal addresses) should be made by:

Electoral system

The first past the post (FPP) electoral system will be used for all elections except for the Southern District Health Board which will use the single tranferable voting (STV) electoral system.

Voting period

Voting documents will be sent to all eligible electors, by post, from **Friday 20 September 2019.**

The voting period is three weeks (Friday 20 September 2019 to noon Saturday 12 October 2019). Electors may post their completed voting documents back to the electoral officer using the orange pre-paid envelope sent with their voting document. Completed voting documents can also be hand-delivered to all Council offices from Friday 20 September 2019 to noon Saturday 12 October 2019. Special votes will also be available during the voting period at all Council offices. To be counted, all completed voting documents must be in the hands of the electoral officer or an electoral official by noon Saturday 12 October 2019.

Progress results will be known early afternoon on Saturday 12 October 2019, and preliminary results will be known early on Sunday morning 13 October 2019. These will be accessible on Council's website: www.cluthadc.govt.nz Contact us

The result is an enormous disparity in their learned language.

66 press reader





You can now read (or listen to) magazines and newspapers either at the library or from your own device thanks to a new service offered by Clutha Libraries called Press Reader.

This was introduced to extend the access to NZ and international newspapers and magazines to all of our Clutha community.

It is the most cost effective way for us to offer the range of topics, countries and languages covered.

Introduced in May people from all over the District are really enthusiastic about this library service.

One person was even reading their daily newspaper at 3am! And it is all ages! The APP option is also proving very popular.

In the first 8 weeks from late April to late June there were:

At least 1,008 users

- 6,383 sessions
- 12,528 articles read
- 4,567 issues read (1,111 magazines, [869 print magazine loans during the same period] and 3,456 newspapers)
- 570 different titles (329 magazines and 241 newspapers)

Woman's Day is the most popular magazine – but there is a strong following for the ODT, Southland Times, Washington Post, The Dominion Post, The Press, The Nelson Mail and a lot of people exploring

minor accident form

Did you know the Clutha District Council has a minor road accident report form available? When you complete the form it tells us when, where and how the minor accident happened so we can investigate the condition of the road, and make sure it is safe for everyone to travel on. This form is for tourists and locals to fill in, including those that have helped out at minor incidents by pulling a car out of a ditch and helping someone get back on the road.

Please remember if we don't know an accident has happened then we don't know to investigate the road surface, and repair if needed.
