I want to personally thank everyone for allowing me the privilege of being Mayor, this is a life challenge that means so much to me, and to now have the chance to continue to play my part in a defining time for Clutha is humbling.

Thanks to the outgoing Council, the last three years has seen a continuation of the spirit and decency that is a cornerstone of our Council. We still spark up at each other when its needed, but then respect and goodwill prevails, and as we challenge the future trajectory of the District we love. I have been immensely proud of the collective determination that has been shown as we attempt to do our best for all the district.

After a sustained period of structural changes in council, and a focus on embracing the public in an attempt to gain consensus and formulate a plan for the districts future, without a doubt the next three years are about implementation, we are going to see projects advance that collectively have been chosen to break our Districts inertia after a generation of enduring population decline and all the systemic challenges that radiate from this.

Milton especially will get the transformation it desperately needs, and this triennium will see a cycle trail, a community facility and destination toilets to complement the upgrade of the main street, along with a focus on core services including

a water pipeline that connects Milton and Waihola allowing the latter to expand. Across the District community plans will continue to be rolled out and implemented and it is important that every ratepayer understands our wider tactic and the needs it will address.

The greatest impediment to our Districts economy



is twofold, we, like the rest of the lower South Island are struggling to attract a workforce to fill the huge number of jobs presently on offer throughout Clutha, and if we did manage to attract staff where are we going to house them. There is a complexity to this challenge that requires a cohesive response, and council has already identified that developers are spoilt for choice and predominantly lured to the likes of Queenstown so we must develop our own strategy.

Put simply for almost 50 years Clutha has slowly drained its populace, predominantly our young have left, to the detriment of school and doctors rolls, and the vibrancy and vitality of our communities, the problems until recent times were starting to gain pace with aging housing, and dilapidation contributing to

Only rain down the drain

Stormwater drains and pipes are made to collect rainwater efficiently, and transfer that water to local streams and rivers.

There is a separate system of sewer pipes for dirty water (the water that comes from toilets, kitchen sinks, your laundry etc.)

Importantly this dirty water goes to a treatment plant, not straight into a stream or river.

These separate systems mean it is vital that dirty water is kept out of storm drains so our rivers stay clean.

To avoid polluting our waterways, we need to be aware of activities that can cause contamination.

These include washing vehicles and boats in yards and driveways, washing out paintbrushes, letting cattle wander through drains, washing spilled chemicals down the drain, and tipping away engine oil, paint thinners or the like.

DRIVE MY LIFE

The Community Driver Mentor Programme (Drive My Life, South Otago) is a new initiative between the Clutha District Council Road Safety Programme and Balclutha Police.

Rachel Harrison (Road Safety Coordinator) and Rochelle Gordon (Balclutha Police Community Constable) are hoping to get the programme underway at the beginning of the year. With fantastic support from Drive my Life Invercargill and Gore things are moving ahead.

The programme will be based on offering those without a drivers licence the chance to take part in a free 12 week programme which includes (if needed) learners, restricted and full licence costs and 12 weeks of lessons from a mentor.

There are a number of youth (and others) who may be driving without a licence, or just have no means of moving on to the next level in the graduated system. This way we can get as many as possible driving with a full licence and under guidance of the mentors, driving safely and confidently on our roads.

Community support has been fantastic with many organisations indicating that they may be willing to come on board. We have some support from The Trusts Community Foundation and Otago Motoring Trust with some funding for petrol costs and advertising etc but we are still hoping to get a car we can use for this.
